It's hard to believe that a month ago I was in the beautiful Rocky Mountains. I am amazed at the beauty of God's creation as we explored through the Rocky Mountain National Park, Pike's Peak, the Garden of the Gods, Seven Falls, and Manitou Cliff Dwellings. It will never cease to

amaze me how the mountains are like chameleons, depending if you



are approaching from the east, west, north, or south. Driving through the flat plains of Kansas, and Nebraska we saw the diversity of God's creation. We left the foot of the mountain with 90 degree temps and then arrived at the summit of Pike's Peak with wind chill of 38 degrees-- brrr... but

so refreshing after our long summer of 90+ temps. The rocks, and stones varied from red, brown, gray, black, and sand colors-- It was truly a week I stood in Awe of the Wonders of my Creator.

The following week I attended a "Peaks of Excellence Leadership Conference" at the Colorado Springs United Methodist Church. It was a time to learn from some of the top United Methodist pastors and cutting edge ministry gurus in the United States. There were a wide range of topics which included, Effective Singles Ministry, Practical Planning for Small and Mid-Size Churches, Personal Transformation



Precedes Corporate Transformation, 20 Ways to Use the Media in Worship, The Shape of Healing: Simple Ways the Church Can Care for Hurting Children and Families, Design Matters: 7 Principles for More Effective Visuals in Worship.

I listened to Keynote addresses on Bearing Fruit, Children's Ministry, Media in Worship, and Generation to Generation. My mind is still swirling with all the information that I have consumed in the last month. I am still processing, and praying that God will help me discern the direction and shape of the future ministry of the Clinton First UMC.

What I can tell you is we are serving an amazing, wonderful, compassionate, creative God who created all humans to be in relationship with HIM. We live in a community (5 mile radius of our church) that is only 17% church—this means that 83% of your neighbors and mine do not attend church-- some may know about God; they may have attended church years ago and become dissatisfied, disillusioned, angry, or let down; they may claim they don't need to go to church to worship God; others may have never heard what God and Jesus are all about.

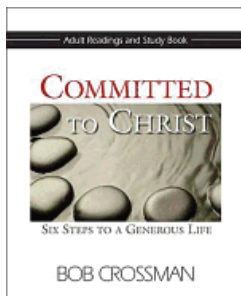

What this tells me is that we have a mission field right in our back door. It is filled with people who live in the same town you do, shop in the same stores, their children attend the same schools and play on same teams as your children and/or grandchildren; they go to the same doctors; same restaurant, etc. In many, many ways they have a lot in common with us—but they have a few things missing—that are vital to our lives. They do not have a Lord and Savior to turn to and talk to, seeking daily guidance, peace, comfort, and direction; they do not have the hope of salvation. They do not have a church family to be there for them to love, support, encourage, and help through tough life situations and circumstances in which we count on our Church family to be there for us.

September is considered by many to be “Back to Church” month. So I want to encourage you to pray, seek God's guidance, and ask Him to reveal to you the “Person/s, family/ies, he wants you to invite to come and join us. What a better time to get back into the swing of things and do something that may transform our community one life at a time, and make our world a much better place for all to live.

In March, a team of Ed Shew, Brian Hutchinson, Mike Rennick, Virginia Schragel, Ken and Susie Pierce, Mitch Marsolf, Kathy Haraburda, and Pastor Susan, began the Fruitful Congregation Journey – Small Church Initiative. They have been spending one Saturday every two months at Gobin UMC in Greencastle, in a session led by Ann Handschu, with FCJ teams from the Ellettsville UMC, Veedersburg UMC, and North Union UMC of Brazil. These sessions have been geared toward developing Church leaders and helping us explore ways we can be more effective in our community. We have two sessions left of the first step of our journey.

We have covered these topics:

- Session 1 – Building the Case for Hope
- Session 2 – Getting Beyond Our Church Walls
- Session 3 – Leadership Development: Foundations for Growth
- Session 4 – Empowering Laity Beyond Committees
- Session 5 – Casting Vision for Missional Clarity
- Session 6 – Developing Vision Statements and Goal Setting

We will be deciding if we are going to move on to Step 2, which will help your church assess its strengths and weakness and to identify three key objectives that will help your church to move forward. With the help of a coach, Step 3 will help your church implement the key objectives identified in Step 2. This typically will take 12-18 months.

The great thing about this process is that not only do they help you determine the objectives or the prescriptions, but the next phase is sending a consultant to walk side by side with us to make it happen.

The church council will be making the decision soon if we are going to be moving on into the next steps. Please pray that God will guide them to make the best decision for your church—and the Clinton Community.

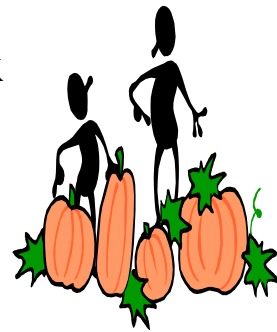

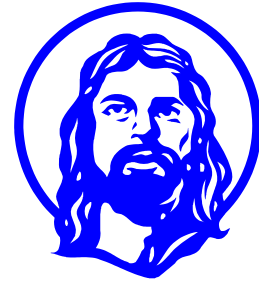
